

### **JOB DESCRIPTION**

The Ann and Joe O. Neuhoff School of Ministry at the University of Dallas, in Irving, Texas, seeks applicants for a full time, tenure track faculty position as ASSISTANT PROFESSOR in Practical Theology. The Assistant Professor of Practical Theology will teach courses that serve the graduate, undergraduate, and/or continuing education programs of the Neuhoff School of Ministry. Successful experience in cross-cultural ministry and proficiency in Spanish are desirable. Experience with online teaching is also desirable.

### **PRIMARY RESPONSIBILITIES**

- ✓ Prepare and deliver instruction, which may include lectures and class discussions, to undergraduate, graduate and/or continuing education students.
- ✓ Evaluate and grade students' assignments and papers; provide timely feedback on grades.
- ✓ Maintain student attendance records, grades, and other required information.
- ✓ Plan, evaluate, and revise course content, course materials, and methods of instruction.
- ✓ Maintain regularly scheduled office hours to advise and assist students.
- ✓ Keep abreast of developments in the field by reading current literature, talking with colleagues, and participating in professional or industry associations.
- ✓ Make ongoing contributions to academic and professional scholarship through peer-reviewed articles, scholarly presentations, and books in one's area of specialization.
- ✓ Participate in meetings pertinent to faculty professional responsibilities, including standing and ad hoc committees.

- ✓ Earned terminal degree in practical theology, ministry, or related field by time of appointment
- ✓ Thorough knowledge of and appreciation for Catholic theological tradition and pastoral practice, including contemporary theology and practice of ministry
- ✓ Significant experience in teaching adults and undergraduates
- ✓ An established record of research and an active research plan
- ✓ Significant pastoral experience in a Catholic setting
- ✓ Demonstrated record of success in ministerial formation

### **PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS**

- ✓ Successful experience in cross-cultural ministry
- ✓ Teaching competency in another related field of theological and ministerial studies such as pastoral care and counseling, Catholic social teaching, ministerial ethics, intercultural ministry
