

JOB DESCRIPTION

The University of Dallas's Braniff Graduate School invites applications for a full-time, tenure-track faculty position. Rank is at the assistant professor level with a willingness to consider extraordinary candidates at higher ranks. The Humanities position with a concentration in Classical Education includes instruction at the graduate level. Although two-thirds of this position will be in Classical Education—and rank and tenure will be determined within this program—the appropriate candidate will be one-third in a related discipline in the liberal arts such as English, Classics, History, Philosophy, or Politics.

Research expectations include publication appropriate to the newly developing field of classical education, with greater emphasis than usual on applied research and scholarship, including curricular development and academic, and when appropriate non-academic, writing on classical education and the liberal arts. Service responsibilities include helping to develop this burgeoning program, which is the fastest growing program in the Braniff Graduate School, both through creativity regarding curriculum development and willingness to participate in the promotion of the program.
