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**JOB DESCRIPTION**

The Modern Languages department invites new or recent Spanish doctoral recipients to serve as a postdoctoral teaching fellow for a term of two years, renewable for one additional year. The unique emphasis for this position is to provide experience in the integration of fields such as literature, history, art history, or linguistics into the Spanish curriculum of the university's core language requirement.

Teaching responsibilities will include Spanish courses at all levels. The successful candidate will teach three courses each semester including the final course of the core language requirement in Spanish, Second-Year Spanish II. A hallmark of the Spanish Program at the University of Dallas is our study of the Hispanic world in relation to the Western Tradition of liberal arts education and the Catholic intellectual tradition. Our Second-Year Spanish II course introduces students to the heritage of the Spanish-speaking world within the context of these traditions. This course is a survey course that considers Spanish Peninsular and Spanish American histories, literatures, as well as the rich diversity of Hispanic cultures. Candidates are invited to consider how their research interests/specializations might be integrated into this course.

- support the Spanish Program's collaboration and interdisciplinary dialogues with other departments on campus while contributing to intradepartmental discussions and programming on second-year language pedagogical innovation.

Applicants must have earned a Ph.D. in Spanish or linguistics by May 2019, and should not have earned their degree earlier than 2016.

- A Ph.D. in Spanish or linguistics
- Some teaching experience
- Interest in liberal arts and liberal learning
